Improving salaries and pay equity for the nation's library personnel, professional and paraprofessional alike, remain central concerns of the American Library Association's current "Campaign for America's Libraries." Allocations to libraries are undergoing drastic reductions in a number of states, including Michigan, with commensurate negative effect on library personnel renumberation. Accordingly, the Michigan Library Association sent representatives to the ALA Annual Conference 2002 in Atlanta to receive specialized training in advocating salary and pay equity issues. *LIBRARIAN & STAFF SALARIES* is a workshop moderated by MLA members who were trained at the ALA conference, and will center on preparing library staffs to address such issues within their communities.
